



History of the NEC

- NEC contracts were first published in 1993 to facilitate and encourage good management of risks using clear and simple language and appropriate risk allocation.
- "...a spirit of mutual trust and cooperation."
- Latham suggested that if his recommendations were adopted by the Construction Industry savings of 30% could be achieved over five years.

Nec 4 Changes Evolution not Revolution

- Standard format
- Inclusion of more core clauses
- Introduction of the Service Manager
- Use of common industry terms









Nec 4 Changes Evolution not Revolution

Clause 10.1 & 10.2

NEC collaboration

Legally enforceable?

Van Oord UK v Dragados UK [2020] CSOH 87

Lord Woolman held that clause 10.2 was not "merely an avowal of aspiration" but instead reflected and reinforced the general principle of good faith in the contract

- Moving away from 'business as usual'


- Objectivity What is happening?

- Look for opportunities for collaboration




